



To whom it may concern,

At&t Mobility prides itself in being a positive addition to any community that it provides service to. At&t strives to be a asset to the communication infrastructure of a township or city by giving the residents another reliable option for their communication needs. Unfortunately, there is a perception in the eyes of some that the support structures used to make our network operate add a negative aspect to the landscape in general. When locating a support structure, field agents do the best possible job in placing the structures so as to not negatively impact the viewshed of neighboring parcels.

During the process of citing the proposed support structure for the Augusta Charter Township area (Willis, MI) some public comment was brought to our attention. This is taken very seriously and every effort is being taken to accommodate the concerns that were raised.

As you can see on the included aerial map, At&t is moving the proposed site further into the parent parcel owned by Grace McCune to alleviate the concerns of the support structure being too close to the neighboring parcels and the public right-of-way. This will in turn dramatically increase the amount of footage the proposed support structure exceeds the required setbacks (per the Augusta Charter Township Ordinance). Further, the placing of the proposed compound behind an existing mature oak tree in the field will help diminish the visual aspect of the facility as a whole.

In summary, At&t considers itself a guest in Augusta Charter Township and is making an upmost effort to provide the service of reliable wireless communication and at the same time fulfill its mandate required by the FCC to adequately cover the area it has been given a license for. At&t Mobility has a Radio Frequency License from the FCC for the state of Michigan. The FCC requires its licensees to provide adequate and reliable service in the licensed area as specified in Title 47, Part 24.103 of the Code of Federal Regulations. In order to fulfill this requirement for its license, At&t Mobility needs to provide continuous, uninterrupted, wireless communication service to the Augusta Charter Township area. **Without the proposed site, At&t Mobility will suffer several hardships:** 1.) disruption of the network design; 2.) compromising the coverage area; 3.) At&t Mobility's inability to provide adequate and reliable coverage to the public. **The proposed site will allow At&t to provide the quality of service required by the FCC and demanded by the public.** Thank you for your continued consideration concerning this application.
